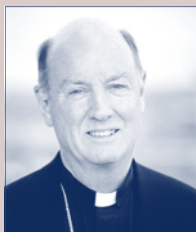

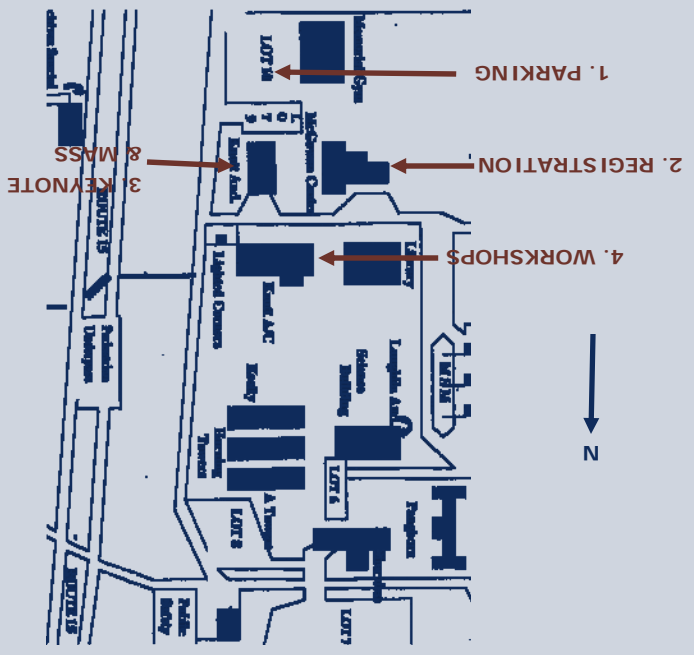

**Directions to the Main Campus,

**From Northern Carroll County:** Take MD 140 west through Westminster and Taneytown to US 15 at Emmitsburg. Take US 15 South two miles to the University.


**From Baltimore:** Take Interstate 70 West to Frederick. Follow signs for US 15 North toward Gettysburg. Take US 15 approx. 25 miles to University.

**From Western Maryland:** Take I-70 East to US 15 North, to University as above.

**From Washington DC/Suburban MD:** Take I-495 Washington Beltway around western side of metropolitan area across Potomac River to I-270N to Frederick. Follow I-270N to US 15 North to University.
