1. Review of Current program

Readings/Prayer/Music Brainstorming

Group decided on Luke 10:1-11 as basis for prayer service:

¹ After this the Lord appointed seventy (-two) ² others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit.
 He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest.
 Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves.
³ Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way.
 Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.'⁴
 If a peaceful person ⁵ lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you.
 Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you,
 cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.'
 Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand.

Also decided to build Matthew 28:16-23 into Bishop's prayer:

⁸ The eleven ⁹ disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. ¹⁰ When they saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. ¹¹ Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, ¹² and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. ¹³ And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."
